The Spirit's Universal Thoughts is a God. Together they are One. Wholly Spirit. At the end of his three year mission, During the last supper, Christ, in Jesus, announced that the Father and He had become one. Two, as One. Then he reminded them that shortly he would be gone, that his very leaving would bring, or enable, the comforter. During the weeks ahead the disciples had to negotiate the space between having the Presence of Christ amongst them to finding the Holy Spirit within themselves and each other. At Pentecost each saw the light, like a flame above each other's heads. We recognise the Holy Spirit more easily in each other than in ourselves, an indication that Christ lives in the space between us, where 2 or 3 are gathered in the name of Love and Truth, that came through Jesus.

Our thinking is dark. There is no human problem that can be solved by normal thinking. Technical problems, yes, but in problems of our humanity, such as relationships, or for healing situations (like the environment,) thought-out solutions that do not involve spirit-vision simply cause more problems. To practise spirit vision, we have to open our hearts and use our intuition, too. Only then do solutions we bring begin to help. In other words, one aspect of our human spirit does no good, it needs the whole, the holy spirit to bring goodness into life.

So long as we feel that we, ourselves, have a potential solution, things continue to get worse. When, aware of our own failing, we lift up our souls in prayer (craving for light) we open our thinking to the Cosmic Thinking and can begin to become whole, begin to allow the Light of the Holy Spirit to shine into the world through us, rather than seeking to be the light that shines.
